
The anatomy of a Drone Bee

Appearance

- It is the Male bee
- unlike the female bee they do not have stingers and they do not gather pollen
- Drones are the larger bees hanging around hives



How they work

- Drones carry only one type of allele at each chromosomal position
- Drones die off or are ejected from the hive by the worker bees in late autumn, and do not reappear in the beehive until late spring.
- They mate with Queen bees They simply see who can fly closest to successfully mate.
- The CIA had been flying unarmed drones over Afghanistan since 2000

Locations for drones

- An Apis colony has about 200 drones during high summer peak time.
- It was ten years ago this month, on February 4, 2002, that the CIA first used an unmanned Predator drone in a targeted killing
